

TRIBAL SAFETY PROGRAM DETAILS

(DPS, EMERGENCY MEDICAL, EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT & FIRE)

Interns participating in the Tribal Safety Program will have an opportunity to work through in person, following Tribal health and safety plans, (and occasional online) programming with several safety related departments at San Manuel.

The 10-week course (both 20-hour and 40-hour commitments are available) provides interns training and skills to work with or support the Emergency Medical, Emergency Management, Fire Department, and Department of Public Safety teams here at San Manuel.

To start, you would be practicing important life skills and safety techniques that you can use right now in your home and life and later on, if interested, as a career.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL (POC: Ann Martgan, EMS Operations Manager, Fire Department)
4 hours (in person or hybrid) to complete the training and assessments necessary to receive an American Red Cross CPR card. Test for CPR card must be done in-person.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (POC: Tom Woodard, Disaster Services Manager, Fire Department)
4-6 hours (in person or online) to complete introductory Tribal Emergency Response Training (TERT) training in emergency management techniques and practices.

FIRE DEPARTMENT (POC: Captain Tito Smith, Fire Chief, Fire Department, in cooperation with Learning for Life/Boy Scouts of America)
6-15 hours (mostly in person but with a few online options for content) to learn fire service training under the supervision of trained firefighters.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
(POC: Tom Ramos, Director of Reservation Administration and Operations and Ernie Sanchez, VP Department of Public Safety)
6-15 hours (all done in person, following the Tribal health and safety plan) to learn public safety practices under the supervision of trained Department of Public Safety personnel.
