

### San Manuel Prioritizes Neighborhood Traffic Management and Safety

As San Manuel Casino continues to welcome back guests and prepare for the opening of its first phase of expansion in July, we want to assure our neighbors that the Tribe continues to work with local cities and agencies, including the City of San Bernardino Police Department (SBPD) and the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department to manage traffic and safety near the Reservation.

A formal Community Safety Funding agreement with SBPD has been in place for years and includes an *additional services* contract that provides dedicated officers to help manage traffic on busier days, such as holidays.

In addition to proactive traffic management, the Tribe, through the Community Safety Funding agreement and other grants, provides for the following services:

- · funds for additional overtime shifts for SBPD police officers
- purchase of patrol and community enforcement vehicles
- · purchase of traffic cameras and other equipment

The Tribe has also arranged for regular maintenance of Victoria and Highland Avenue and provided funding for crossing guards for Belvedere Elementary and Serrano Middle Schools (through San Bernardino City Unified School District).

# San Manuel Continues Support of Animal Services in Our Community



We all love our animals, and the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians has given the San Bernardino Animal Services Department a \$1.5 million grant over three years to enhance that department's valuable services for animals and pet owners. The grant will fund facility improvements, animal control vehicles, and essential programs such as spay and neuter services, microchipping, and medical treatment. The Animal Services Department has set aside \$500,000 of this grant to help fund a new Animal Shelter.

"We are looking forward to working with the city on this great opportunity for the community and our animal friends," said San Manuel Chairman Ken Ramirez. "As stewards of the land and of its inhabitants, we follow our ancestor's legacy by not only looking out for our people and the community, but also its animals."

The grant is a continuation of our commitment to caring for our furry and fluffy friends. Did you know that San Manuel's Department of Public Safety (DPS) has its own shelter to care for stray animals that have wandered onto the reservation?

Animals who arrive at the DPS Animal Shelter are photographed, and DPS officers work with local animal shelters to reunite pets with their owners. Pets are held for 14 days before they are put up for adoption or transferred to an off-site rescue shelter.
